Dear Old Providence Family,

By the time this newsletter reaches you I suspect that the outside will look greener and the weather will feel warmer! Spring is upon us, and with spring comes Easter and the celebration of Christ's resurrection. Let us all glory in the tangible reminders of the season that point to newness of life. In addition, let us turn our minds to the passion of our Savior's crucifixion, the glory of His resurrection, and what these things really mean for us.

God's Word tells us in I Corinthians 15: 16-19 that *"If the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is worthless; you are still in your sins. Those, then, who have fallen asleep in Christ have also perished. If we have put our hope in Christ for this life only, we should be pitied more than anyone."* When it comes to the core of who we are, as the people of God, and what it is we really believe, everything hinges on Jesus being raised from the dead. This is true to the point that, as verse 19 says, if Jesus was NOT raised from the dead then we are to be pitied above all others. Why? Think about Easter as it relates just to Old Providence.

Our plans for this year's Easter service are quite different than normal. Instead of having two services, a sunrise service and a morning service, we are having only one service which will be held outside, at the Stone Hall, at 7:00 a.m. How silly this must look to those who have not placed their faith in Jesus Christ! Loads of people gathered outside, in the cold, on what would otherwise be a perfectly good morning to sleep in? To those who do not know Jesus, this would be preposterous! And rightfully so, because ultimately, those who do not know Jesus view our devotion as silly. In I Corinthians 15 The Apostle is simply pointing out the obvious. Our faith would be worthless apart from the promise of the resurrection. Yet we make the commitment to worship, to live lives of devotion, to forsake the ways of the world, and yes, to even gather outside at 7:00 a.m. on Easter Sunday because we believe that Christ was raised from the dead and that this promise of the resurrection is given to His people. And let us not forget those brothers and sisters in Christ around the world who are persecuted, and who meet to worship the risen Savior and are in harm's way every single day as a result.

The risen Jesus being alive today, and the promise of the resurrection for those who trust in Him alone for their salvation, is what sets Christianity apart from every other religion on earth. We do not follow the ancient teachings of prophets or adhere to lofty philosophies declared by mere men, long since dead. Jesus is alive. God's Word continues in I Corinthians 15: 20-22 by saying *"But as it is, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead also comes through a man. For just as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive."* Let these words encourage you as you consider Christ's sacrifice and glory. Also, please plan to worship with us during Easter and beyond.
